Chester Brass Staying Fit

We are into year 2 of the COVID-19 pandemic and feeling lucky to be in Nova Scotia. After many months on hiatus, the band started slowly returning to the rehearsal hall. Following the guidelines of the Nova Scotia government as well as the NS Band Association recommendations, we started sectional rehearsals under the guidance of our Music Director, George Morrison. In order to keep our members and their families safe, we split the band into two groups, keeping each rehearsal to below 12 people -- the COVID capacity of our rehearsal hall. Each week we either gather as high brass (cornets & flugelhorn) or low brass. Our goal is to be ready for when full rehearsals and concerts can resume. We expect this to be as soon as it is warm enough to play outdoors.

Thank you to all our supporters who provided the funding to keep the band financially secure when we had no other possible revenue sources. Private donations as well as support from the Municipality of Chester through their COVID emergency grant program has allowed us to meet our obligations for the first half of 2021.
